Directives for the Establishment of the Curriculum Working Group for University Interdisciplinary Bachelor's Programs

July 11, 2024	Passed by the University Interdisciplinary Bachelor's Programs Review Panel at its 2 nd meeting
November 15, 2024	Passed by the Center for General Education at its 2 nd meeting, fall semester, Academic Year 2024–25

Article 1 National Taiwan University (NTU or “the University”) University Interdisciplinary Bachelor's Program Review Panel formulates the NTU *Directives for the Establishment of the Curriculum Working Group for University Interdisciplinary Bachelor's Programs* (“the Directives”) in accordance with the NTU *Regulations Governing the Establishment of the Review Panel for University Interdisciplinary Bachelor's Programs* to establish the University Interdisciplinary Bachelor's Programs Curriculum Working Group (“the Working Group”) and handle matters pertaining to the review of the University Interdisciplinary Bachelor's Program curricula.

Article 2 The Working Group shall consist of seven members elected from among the members of the University Interdisciplinary Bachelor's Program Review Panel. They shall serve a one-year term and may serve consecutive terms. The convener shall be appointed by the Director of the NTU Center for General Education from among the members of the Working Group.

Article 3 The duties of the Working Group are as follows:

1. Planning and deliberating the provision of and changes to courses offered by the University Interdisciplinary Bachelor's Programs.
2. Reviewing applications for changes to the following matters, submitted by University Interdisciplinary Bachelor's Program students during their period of study:
 - 1) Internship, practicum, or topical courses.
 - 2) Specialization programs, credit programs, or interdisciplinary specializations.
 - 3) Title of specialization programs or bachelor's programs.
 - 4) Other matters that shall be deliberated by the Working Group.

Article 4 The Working Group may only convene with at least half of its members in attendance, and a resolution may only be made with more than half of the attending members in concurrence.

Members of the Working Group who are unable to attend a meeting for justifiable reasons may not appoint proxies to attend on their behalf.

The Working Group may invite students or concerned parties to sit in on meetings and make statements.

Article 5 In the event of time-sensitive circumstances, natural disasters, epidemics, or other *force majeure* events, the Working Group may convene via correspondence upon approval of the convener.

The correspondence stipulated in the preceding paragraph shall, in principle, be conducted via email. Members of the Working Group who respond by the reply deadline specified in the email shall be deemed to have attended the meeting.

Article 6 The Directives shall be passed by the University Interdisciplinary Bachelor's Programs Review Panel and the Center for General Education, and then implemented on the date of promulgation.
